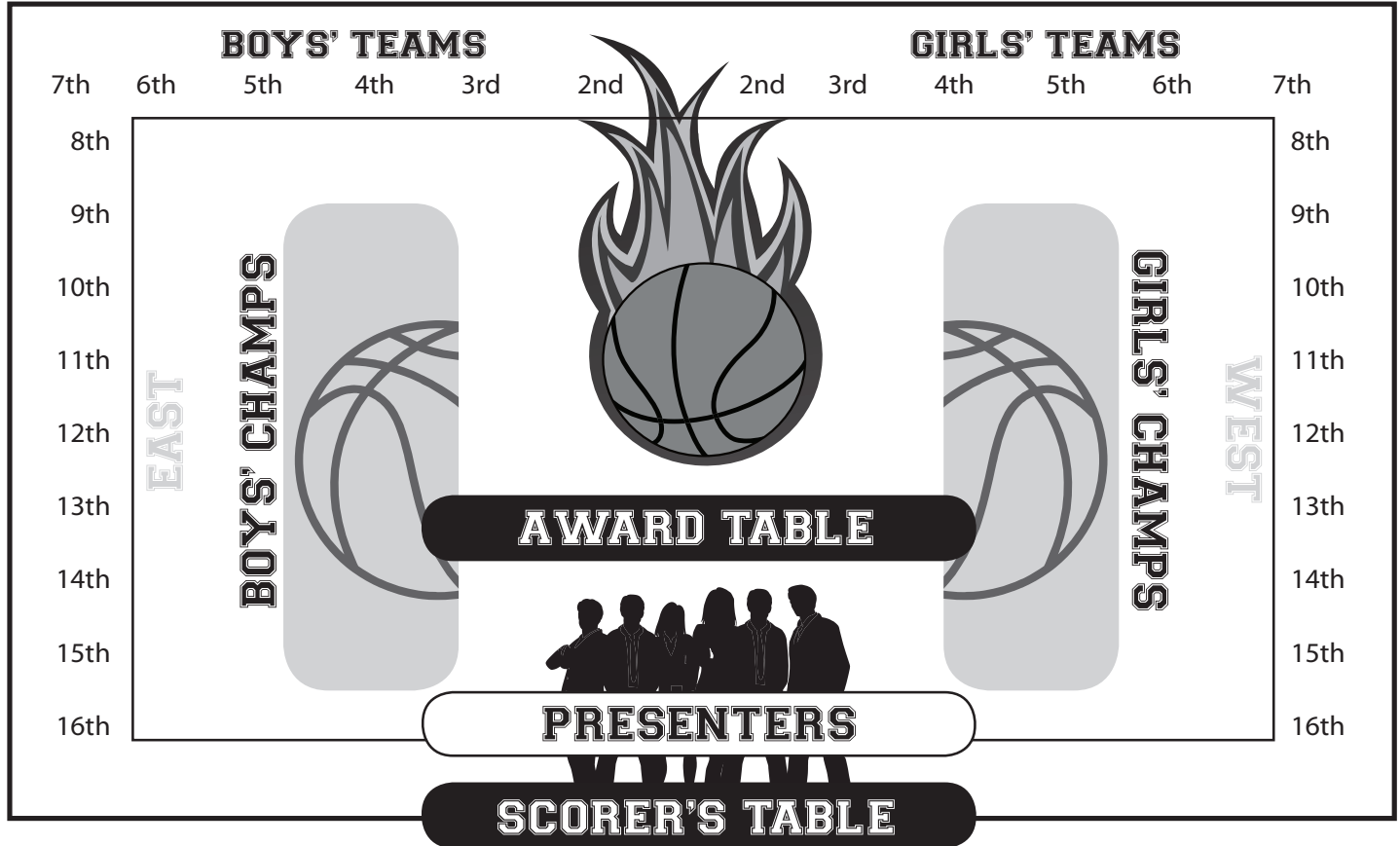

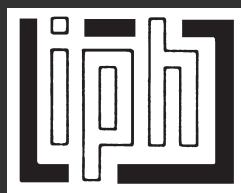
2011 GAME STAR AWARDS

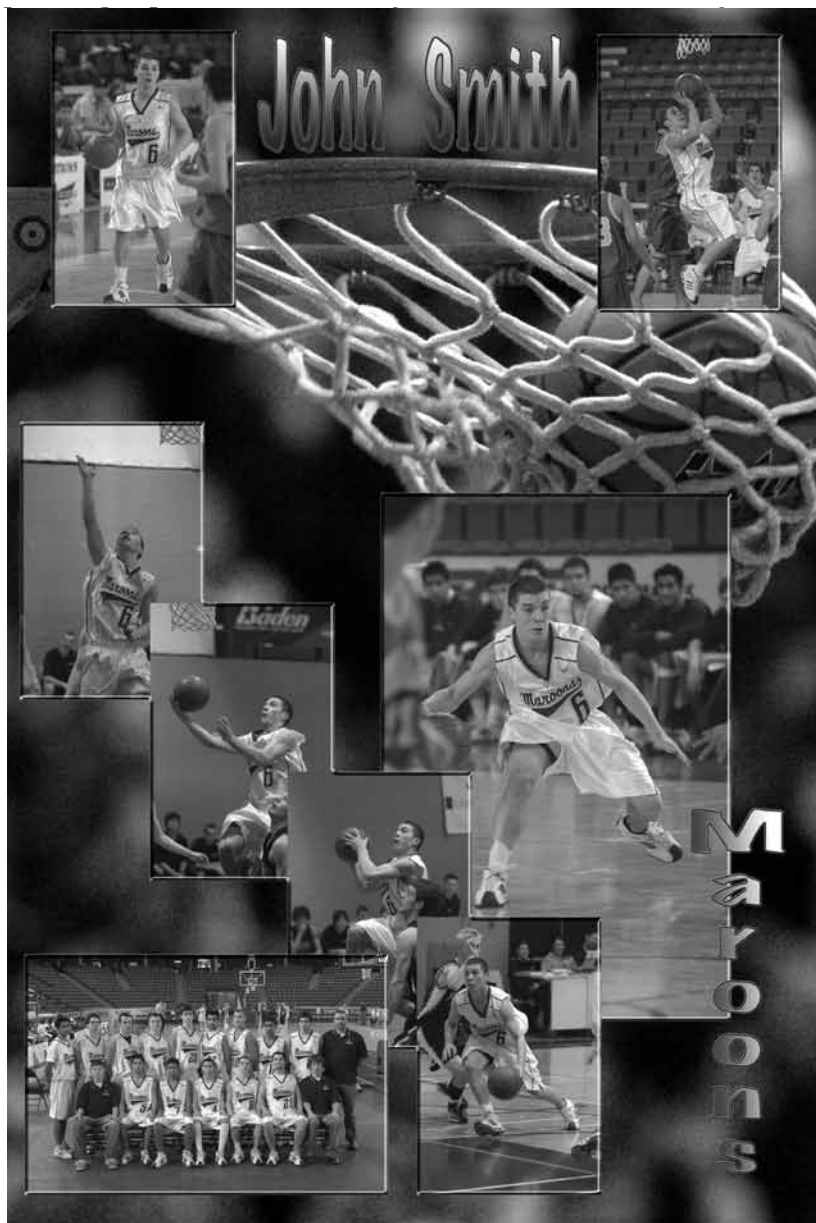

to rampage through the second and third quarters, outscoring Little Flower 40-6 including a 32 – run. Little Flower find themselves 1-10 in provincial finals including finishing runner-up six of the past seven years: The final saw three peat MVP Lisa Tindle lead the bug run for York House with a tem high 22 points. Lisa Grierson added 14 and senior Robyn Wilson had 13. Little Flower grade 11 Stephanie Shea had 16 to pace Little Flower. Little Flower's road to the final included wins over Gulf Island 73-43, Kalamalka 75-44, and Abby Christian 61-49 while York House prevailed over Prince Rupert 84-26, College Heights 64-44 and Lord Tweedsmuir 59-41. Lisa Tindle finished an outstanding career at York House with her third consecutive Most Valuable Player selection in this tournament.

2006 – York House Tigers used to 2006 “AA” Championship to establish a record breaking sixth Championship and fifth consecutive win in the final game. The twenty-first century of “AA” Girls Basketball to this point, belongs to the York House Tigers. The Tigers used the usual waves of substitutions and much better penetration to manage at least a minor upset over top seeded North Vancouver's Sutherland. Without their perennial MVP Lisa Tindle to run their offense, team depth and balance came to the fore, affording York House the opportunity of avenging a close loss to Sutherland in the Lower mainland Zone Final. Sutherland led in this game as late as the early stages of the third quarter, but went nearly five minutes of the third quarter without a field goal and York House moved into what would prove to be an insurmountable 47-38 lead. York House was lead by Stephanie Scott with 17 points, while Robyn Fashler again backed her up with 12 and Eleni Balomenas and Jennifer Kali each had 10. Sutherland was led by Suzanne Wilson and Tournament MVP Leanna Gildersleeve and with 16. Sutherland's road to the final included wins over Pacific Academy 69-35, College Heights 64-56 and DP Todd 61-52. York House visited Norkam 51-34, Vernon 59-52 and St. Michael's 57-37 on their way to their record win.

2007 – Everything has to end sometime, even the Provincial “AA” reign of the York House Tigers, bidding for a sixth straight provincial title and seventh in the past eight years. The stumbling block for the top-seeded team in the province proved to be one team deep enough and athletic enough to match-up, and the result was a classic final game in which a Pride of Lions topped off the Tigers in overtime. The game features precision perimeter shooting from the Tigers' Stephanie Scott and pressure in you face defense from start to finish by both teams. Lambrick got poised court leadership throughout from grade 12 guard Kelsey Anonsen, combined with frenetic driving and defense by grade 11 Megan Thompson. The game was virtually deadlocked through the second half, but York House could only wait in agony as Lambrick went to the line with second lift only to miss the front end of one and one's sending the game to overtime. In the overtime, Kelsey Anonsen made a key go-ahead driving hoop in traffic in the final minute followed by three clinching foul-shots by Ashley Stevenson. Final scoring showed Megan Thompson with 23, Kelsey Anonsen 15 and Ashley Stevenson 9 for Lambrick while York House was led by senior Stephanie Scott with 21 and 16 each by fellow seniors Robyn Fashler and Jennifer Kalil. York House's road to the final included wins over David Thompson 73-37. Prince George Duchess Park 68-39 and Holy Cross 46-39 while Lambrick Park's journey to destiny included victories over DP Todd 105-81, Mission 53-50 and Prince Rupert 73-46.

2008 – Mission Road Runners the number one seeded team in BC “AA” Girl's Basketball did nothing to disappoint in capturing their first ever “AA” Provincial hoops title. Mission held a narrow lead for much of the game and maintained a five or six point margin for most of the final quarter, despite typically clutch play down the stretch by York House star Roya Assada. Assada topped all scorers in the game with 29 points as the only Tiger in double-figures. Pamela Balomenos had seven more in the loss. For Mission the scoring was deeper and better balanced, with 6'1” senior Ellise Lepine the top scorer and team leader in the game with 20 points, to go with 11 from Aurora Goodier, nine by Chelsea Reist and eight by Thersa Jakobs. Mission also got a typically strong defensive game from tournament MVP Aisha Luyken, in what was a very closely contested defensive performance by both teams, By quarters Mission led 9-7, 23-20 and 40-31. In contract to Mission's first ever provincial win, York House were playing in a eighth straight BC final game, finishing runner-up the past two years to go with six straight titles in the years prior to that. Mission's mission included wins over Crofton House 83-39, Valleyview 71-53 and Vernon 57-51 while York House road to the final went through Smithers 60-27, Fulton 65-50 and Kalamalka 59-57.

2009 – Featured Kalamalka of Vernon attempting to win a title as an Okanagan School last accomplished by Summerland in 1984. The final game also featured York House Tigers who were appearing in their ninth straight final attempting to win their seventh Championship. Tigers led this game at the half 32-29 seemingly right where they wanted to be in trying to wear down a big Kalamalka team that were top seeded in the tournament. That lead disappeared on a heart-beat as senior guard Claire Nyrose scored a pair of quick baskets to open the second half and Lakers simply streamrolled offensively from that point led by the offense and shot blocking defense of Tournament MVP Nayo Raincock-Ekunwe. Raincock-Ekunwe led all scorers with 27 while Nyrose finished with 17 and Olivia Vardabasso with 15. York House as usual was led by grade 11 Roya Assadi with 19, Rae-Maryse Laljee with 10 and Alisha Roberts and Jessica Eng with 9 each. York House road to the final included wins over Carihi 100-27, Saqhali 80-53 and Mission 69-53. Kalamalka's first Provincial “AA” Basketball Championship and road to the final included wins over Smithers 100-34, Windsor 79-38 and Vernon 64-37.

2010 marked a second straight appearance by an Okanagan School as Clarence Fulton of Vernon was attempting to duplicate the success of Kalamalka in 2009. However, this proved to be an elusive task as Fulton was facing the York House Tigers who were intent on their 7th title in 10 consecutive appearances in the final. York House withstood a determined challenge from Fulton and their Senior Tournament MVP Cassandra Brown during the second half, falling behind briefly late in the fourth quarter. Jessica Eng got six of her eight points for York House at clutch time in that final quarter with fellow senior Roya Assadi scoring 20 and Alisha Roberts 23. Fulton got a game high 36 points from Cassandra Brown to go with 14 from Janice Phung and 12 by Danica Rybachuk. York House led 22-12 at quarter time, 44-38 at half and 57-56 entering the fourth quarter finishing with a final of 79-75. Clarence Fulton's road to the final included wins over Sam Roberts 78-41, Thomas More 87-45 and Mission 72-53 while York House prevailed over Mount Elizabeth 112-32, Holy Cross 79-50 and Nechako Valley 75-25.

girls' tournaments together, to make the "AA" Tournament the largest Provincial Tournament in the Province. York House Tigers emerged as champions in a close, hard fought contest with arch rival Little Flower Academy 70-66. MVP Michelle Sengara with 22 and Meghan Drew McKinstry with 19 led York House offensively. Heide Flores with 21, 18 of those in the second half and Aislinn Keegan with 17 answered for Little Flower Academy. Third place and Most Sportsmanlike Award was taken by Ladysmith over Aldergrove Totems 62-54.

2000 – Riverside Coliseum and The University College of the Cariboo in Kamloops played host once again to the "AA" Championships. First seed Little Flower Academy Angels, last year's runner up, were upset in the finals by Al Ericson's number two seeded Duchess Park Condors despite being tournament total scoring leaders with 304 points. Heidi Flores led the Angels to a 36-28 lead at the half, scoring 15 points. In the third quarter Duchess went on as 12 point run to take a 45-42 lead. The Angels were not able to recover from the deficit and were defeated 68-58 for the second year in a row. Tournament MVP Laura Foster and tournament All Star Morgan Stoner guided the Condors with 25 and 24 points respectively.

2001 – Kamloops, Sport Mart Place and the University College of the Cariboo again played hosts to the "AA" Provincial Championships. Little Flower Academy stormed to a 14-3 lead over Holy Cross Crusaders in the first seven minutes but trailed 30-28 at the half and eventually fell 80-69. It was Crusader guard Taylor Stuart who totally took the game in her hands in the fourth quarter, including a stretch of eight points off two three-pointers, a forced turnover to draw a foul and a pair of free throws, as Holy Cross exploded to a 12 point lead. It was a tough loss for the Angels, who were provincial runner-up for the third straight year and have lost seven of eight championship games in the history of the tournament. Stuart finished with 31, and also has 12 rebounds, six steals, and 12 assists, while Katrina Veecken added ten points and Stephanie Hibbert a dozen. Little Flower got 20 from Lauren LaBrosse and 17 by Heidi Flores. Katie Coopersmith's foul shot with no time on the clock capped a big comeback by Prince George's Duchess Park Condors in a 51-50 victory over Castlegar's Stanley Humphries Rockettes for 3rd place.

2002 – Long-time rivals York House Tigers and Little Flower Academy Angels met in another "AA" girls final in Kamloops' Sport Mart Place. York House streaked out to an 18-7 first quarter lead, en route to a 75-60 victory, as they were never in serious trouble. Quarter scores were 18-7, 33-22 and 48-33. The win was paced by the play of Erin Allan with 21 points, while Lisa Tindle added 16 and Susana Henri 13. For Little Flower Academy Caroline Cannon led all scorers with 24 including 4 three-pointers and Lauren LaBrosse contributed 16 including 6 for 6 at the charity stripe. For Little Flower it was a particularly painful loss, marking the fourth straight year they have been a bridesmaid, however the positive side for Little Flower was the fact that this game marked their ninth final game appearance. On the road to the final York House defeated Prince Rupert 67-38, Abbotsford Christian 78-54 and Westsyde 64-48 proving to be most deserving Provincial Champions. Kam High Red Angels, in an all local match up for third place, defeated Westsyde 66-50. Graduating senior Megan Moon led Kam High with 18 while Michelle Lowey topped all Westsyde scorers with 15.

2003 – Little Flower Academy of Vancouver gave it their best shot but fell short in their bid to upset clear top seed in the BC "AA" girls ball, arch-rival York House Tigers of Vancouver. The two schools have met often over the years and at the BC level both have had great success, but the Little Flower that success has included eight second place finishes in nine finals reached, three of them to York House during the five years running the event has been held in Kamloops. Remarkably, during those five years, Little Flower have lost in the final game all five years. In 2003 the York House Tigers had a few major "AA" challenges all season and in their final game of the season they led Little Flower 30-22 at the half after the teams were virtually deadlocked until late in the second quarter. Little Flower coach Debbie Smallwood had to be extremely proud of a club that played at a level in the 2003 championships they hadn't reached at any point earlier in the season.

York House guard Lisa Tindle anchored her tourney MVP pick by scoring 22 in the final to go with 12 by Carolyn Churchland. Tindle also had nine assists, while Robyn Wilson led on the boards with 11. Little Flower got 15 from senior guard Bridget O'Brien and 21 by Carolyn Cannon. For York House, coached by David Prissinotti, Brent Jackson and Winston Brown it was a successful defence of their BC title and third crown in the past five years. On the road to the final York House defeated Arch Bishop Carney 79-39, Duchess Park 69-35 and St. Thomas Aquinas 61-51 while Little Flower moved to the final through Lambrick Park 89-73, Valleyview 58-55 and Westview 49-45.

2004 – Following the example of Lambrick Park in game 63, the York House Tigers made it three in a row with their win over Westsyde of Kamloops. York House double-teamed the ball with quickness and tenacity, used a full court press, and lightning paced attacks with point guard Lisa Tindle either shooting or dishing to fast breaking forwards cutting behind the defence. Westsyde were clearly victims of a York House team there were wired for the final after playing earlier games at a pace that seemed very leisurely compared to the final. Quite simply they seemed to shift into higher gears as the occasion or opponent demanded. Westsyde did shake off a slow start and took a 12-11 lead seven minutes in, at which point York House began a 23-1 run that decided the game as York House led 47-20 at the half: Lisa Tindle, a 2002 BC Tourney All Star and 2003 "AA" MVP spurred the offense with 20 points in the first half, much of that during the critical 23-1 streak. Tindle finished with 24 points and repeated as BVC "AA" MVP, seeing limited court time as York House substituted freely in the second half. Robyn Wilson has 23 points with Sam Fashler adding 12 for York House. Westsyde senior point guard, Michelle Lowey, had 11 of Westsyde's 20 first half points and finished with 26 for the game. On the road to the final, Westsyde go by DW Poppy 67-59, Little Flower Academy 81-69 and Westview 55-53 while York House bested Prince Charles 96-38, Wellington 77-43 and Abby Christian 82-37.

2005 – The 2005 Provincial "AA" final played at the University College of the Cariboo featured the York House Tigers and the Little Flower Academy Angels in another finals match up of Vancouver private schools. York House posted their fourth consecutive BC title using outstanding team depth to knock over their arch rival 66-38. York House now shares the record of four Provincial titles with Nechako Valley Viqueens. York House actually fell behind 15-8 after the first quarter but proceeded

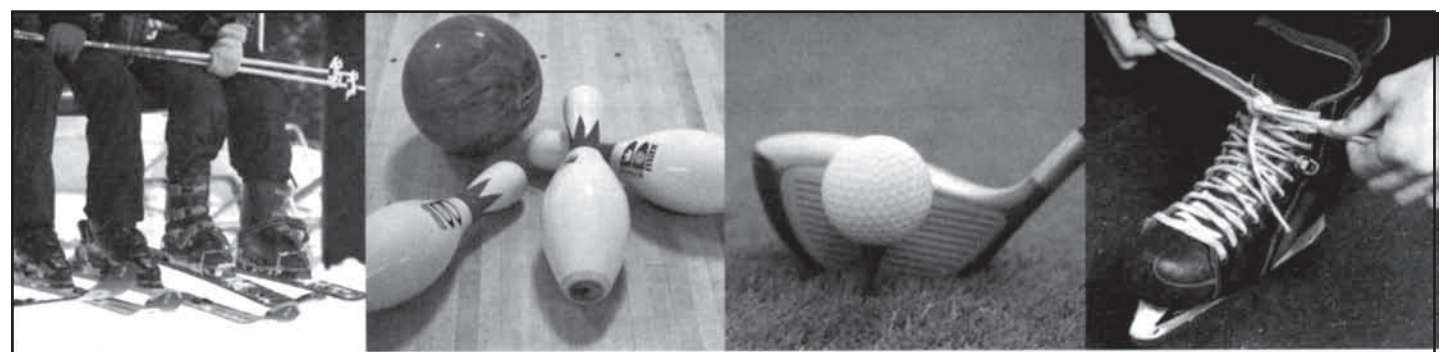

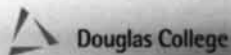

GIRLS TOURNAMENT HISTORY

1981 – Revelstoke hosted this tournament, which opened a new chapter in the “A” Championships. For the first time, sixteen teams competed through a knockout draw under the direction of George Lord. This second expansion tournament saw Okanagan Champion K L O Cougars go undefeated making their second straight appearance in the finals, edging the Aldergrove Totems 42-40 in an exciting come-from-behind victory.

1982 –For the first time, the tournament was held in the North Central Zone, and for the first time, a team was successful in winning a second “A” Championship. Nechako Valley Viqueens, led by the outstanding MVP play of Susan Ewanick, capped an undefeated season sweeping through the 1982 tournament defeating Aldergrove Totems 52-46 in the final.

1983 – The tradition of hosting the tournament in various communities throughout the province continued with the Championship coming to Vancouver Island for the first time at Stelly’s School in Brentwood under the direction of Peter Mason. The Aldergrove Totems, making their third straight final appearance captured their first title with a 52-33 win over the Nechako Valley Viqueens. Westsyde Whundas came third in the tourney.

1984 – The tourney returned to the Fraser Valley with Lawrence Fraser of Aldergrove Secondary as the host. Nechako Valley defeated D P Todd in the highest scoring final ever, 63-59.

1985 – Saw the tournament go to Kelowna under the leadership of Rod Belinski and Bob Shanks. The all-Okanagan final saw Brocklehurst emerge triumphant over A L Fortune 32-30.

1986 – Barry Stewart of Abbotsford directed the first ever “A/AA” combined Championship. Playing before 1800 fans, the “A” final saw Aldergrove down Prince George College 40-30 to become only the second team to capture two Provincial titles.

1987 –The combined “A/AA” Championship moved to Penticton/Summerland where the 1986 runner-up Prince George College Totems, led my MVP Michelle Matte, defeated Windsor 61-55 to win the final.

1988 – The Championship was held at Stanley Humphries High in Castlegar where the Lambrick Park Lions captured their first Provincial title. Tournament MVP, Andrea Loukes, led her team to victory over Notre Dame of Vancouver.

1989 – The BCSSGBA kept pace with the growth of the girls basketball in BC by reclassifying into three categories - “A,” “AA” and “AAA”. The “A” Championship became the “AA” Championships. Lambrick Park captured their second consecutive championship as the Lions roared by Port Hardy 75-46. Third place went to Holy Cross with their 68-62 defeat of K L O.

1990 – Holy Cross in Surrey was the host. In one semi-final, we saw Pitt Meadows defeat Pleasant Valley 44-41, and in the other semi-final, Lambrick Park defeated Notre Dame 65-37. For the third consecutive time, Lambrick Park was once again crowned the BC Champions by defeating Pitt Meadows 72-56.

1991 – Armstrong hosted this tournament which saw Lambrick Park remain Provincial Champs for the fourth year in a row with their 65-52 victory over DW Poppy.

1992 – Held in Prince George, this tournament saw Lambrick Park roll to their fifth consecutive provincial title. Led by MVP, Lisa Bright, and tourney Outstanding Defensive Player, Janis MacIntosh, Lambrick Park defeated Windsor 77-36 in the final.

1993 – Westsyde Secondary of Kamloops hosted the tournament

and emerged as champions. Led by MVP, Cindie Edamura, Westsyde triumphed despite the efforts of the tournament’s first Outstanding Defensive Player, Jackie Richards, of Duchess Park. First and second All-Star Team designators were dropped and an All Tournament Team (top 10 players) and a Defensive All-Star Team (top 5 defensive players) were awarded. The games were held at the University College of the Cariboo, the first time such a venue had been used for the “AA” tourney.

1994 – The “AA” Championships took place once again on Vancouver Island with Kwalikum Secondary (Qualicum Beach) as host with Joe Kupkee directing. The Hatzic Crusaders from Mission battled their way to victory over the Duchess Park Condorettes. First and second All-Star Team designators were dropped. An All-Tournament Team (top 10 players), a Defensive All-Star Team (top 5 defensive players), Tournament’s Outstanding Defensive Player Award (Gen MacDonald from Hatzic), and the Tournament’s Most Valuable Player Award (*Amber Hall from Britannia) were distributed at the closing ceremonies.

1995 – The tournament was hosted by Britannia Secondary School in East Vancouver, the Britannia coach, Mike Evans, as the tournament director. The Britannia girls came in fourth place, following Lambrick Park’s third. A 67-51 defeat in the final game left Windsor in second place while the Duchess Park Condorettes, led by tournament MVP Carrie Wilson, captured the Championship.

1996 – The tournament moved to Pitt Meadows, under the direction of Tournament Chairman, Rich Goulet. The Duchess Park Condorettes swooped down from the North to capture their second consecutive title with an exciting 52-47 victory over Lambrick Park. For the first time, the MVP, Emily King, and the Outstanding Defensive Player, Jay Anna Major, both came from the same team – Duchess Park. Lord Byng outlasted St. Michael’s in the battle for third and fourth 61-56.

1997 – The tournament moved to Clarence Fulton Secondary School in the sunny Okanagan Valley (Vernon) with Larry Grist as chairperson of a great Fulton staff and parent group of volunteers. The Nechako Valley Viqueens completed a storybook year for Coach Hashbarger who was also presented with a Life Membership in the BC Girls Basketball Association. The Viqueens, led by MVP Trina Hutchins, Grade 9 sensation Mandy Hutchins and defensive ace Dianne Fawcett, downed a determined Duchess Park squad in the final 59-41. An impressive Stanley Humphries team came from behind to defeat George Elliot 52-49 for third spot.

1998 – Once again the tournament was hosted by Westsyde Secondary of Kamloops and the UCC campus was used as a venue. This year the Top All Round Player was introduced and was awarded to Rachel Johnson of Duchess Park who was the player that showed the best all round skills throughout the entire tournament. The Nechako Viqueens were once again victorious 68-64 in a hard fought game against the Windsor Dukes. The MVP Mandy Hutchins of the Viqueens, Best Defensive Player Elana Arnold of the Viqueens. Senior girls basketball also said their goodbyes and thanks to three dedicated coaches who retired from coaching after the ‘98 season: Doug Harshbarger of Nechako Valley Viqueens, Joe Miller of the Windsor Dukes and Bob Bridges of the Westsyde Whundas.

1999 – The tournament was moved to Riverside Coliseum and the University College of the Cariboo, bringing both boy’s and
